MINUTES OF COUNCIL

A regular session of Troy City Council was held Monday, August 21, 2017, at 7:00 p.m. in Council Chambers.

INVOCATION: An invocation was given by Council Member Terwilliger, followed by the Pledge of Allegiance.

MINUTES: The Clerk gave a summary of the minutes of the August 7, 2017 meeting of Troy City Council. There were no corrections or additions to these minutes. A motion was made by Mr. Phillips, seconded by Mr. Kendall, to approve these minutes. Motion passed by unanimous roll call vote.

COMMITTEE REPORTS:

Community and Economic Development Committee: Mr. Twiss, Chairman, reported that Committee recommends the three legislative items required by state law related to the Strayer Annexation of 1.952 acres from Concord Township located at 2900 McKaig Road be approved. Those items are a statement of what municipal services will be provided to the area proposed for annexation and a time frame for providing those services; that the City will require buffering of any incompatible uses developed on the newly annexed territory from existing uses on land remaining in the Township; and that the City accepts the annexation. To meet the time line of the state law for an expedited annexation, Committee supports emergency legislation.

Report signed by Kendall, Schweser and Twiss.

Discussion. Mr. Terwilliger asked about the need for emergency legislation, and it was explained that the ORC provides for only 20 days for Council to file the statements and consent with the County.

Law & Ordinance. Mr. Schweser, Chairman, reported that the Ohio Division of Liquor Control has provided a notice of stock transfer of the existing D5F permit that has been issued to Smiths' Boathouse Restaurant LLC, 439 N. Elm Street.

COMMENTS OF MAYOR BEAMISH: Mayor Beamish commented:

-The August 20 Mayors Concert had an attendance of between 2,000 – 3,000.

-Please drive careful as school starts this week.

-On August 27, the Air Force Band of Flight will provide a concert at Treasure Island Park starting at 7:00 p.m.

-August 26 will be the Be the Match Event at Treasure Island Park.

COMMENTS OF MEMBERS OF COUNCIL:

-Mr. Heath thanked those who helped with and attended the annual Festival of Nations event on August 19. It is estimated that approximately 4,000 persons attended the event.

-Mr. Kendall commented that the "Be the Match" Walk and Run event will be held August 26 at Treasure Island Park benefitting those with blood cancers.

CITIZEN COMMENTS:

-Deb Jung, 975 Oak Hill Court, spoke about the speed limit on Troy-Urbana Road which is 45 MPH, which she feels is often exceeded. She commented that visibility from Maplecrest Drive is impeded by trees and the road curves; that the speed limit was once lowered to 35 MPH but was increased back to 45 MPH.

-Lester Conard, 1210 S. Clay Street suggested the Police Department should stop cyclists who do not obey traffic laws. Mr. Conard stated an incident he mentioned was not observed by a police officer. Mr. Titterington commented that the Police Chief has advised that officers do stop cyclists when they are observed not obeying traffic laws.

-Mrs. Oda commented that she has been told by cyclists in clubs that they will not use bike lanes or obey traffic laws.

-Mr. Terwilliger commented that being involved in cycling organizations, he would ask that people not create generalities by a few who may have made comments as his experience is that while some do slide, most cyclists follow biking safety laws.

-Mickey Hammer, 1160 Red Maple Drive, asked if there was an update on the flooding in his neighborhood that was mentioned at the prior meeting. Mr. Titterington and City Engineer Jill Rhoades advised that the storm drain will not be televised for a couple of weeks, the sewer end has been capped correctly, information regarding the elevations is still being checked, and until the elevation information is finalized and the televising of the line completed, there is no update to provide. Mr. Hammer asked if there was more information on his request for a moratorium on building. Mr. Titterington advised that if it is found that the developer is not following the elevations provided by the plans that will be discussed by the Law Director, but the evaluation of the elevations is not yet finalized. Mrs. Rhoades noted that the developer's engineer is checking the elevations, but so far all that can be seen is that on the day there was an enormous amount of rain in a short time, there was nothing to slow the storm water down and no storm sewer is designed to handle the amount of rain that fell in such a short time. Mr. Hammer indicated he believes the water is flowing in the wrong direction.

-Chris Davis, 412 Ellis Street, asked how the bike counters work with two lines, and was told only one click is recorded.

There being no further business, Council adjourned at 7:36 p.m.

- Major Project Update:
 - Extra High Service (EHS) Water Tower - The painting crew is beginning to paint the tower. Substantial completion is estimated for October/November, 2017.
 - Mulberry St. Parking Lot Improvement - Construction has started and is progressing on schedule.
- Over 4,000 people were estimated to have attended Festival of Nations on August 19. The attendees enjoyed a diverse cultural experience and very pleasant weather.
- August 20 was a beautiful evening for those who attended the 25th annual Troy Mayors' Concert. The audience was estimated to be over 2,000.
- The Air Force Band of Flight concert on August 27 at Treasure Island Park was also well attended with an estimated attendance of over 400. The weather was very nice for this concert as well.
- Recreation Director Ken Siler reports that just over 1600 tickets have been sold for Martina McBride- The Joy of Christmas Tour and almost 1400 tickets have now been sold for the Home Free- A Country Christmas concert.
- City Offices will be closed on Labor Day, September 4. Refuse and recycling collection will be on schedule.

Street/Solid Waste – Jerry Mullins, Foreman

- Collected and transported 220 tons of residential trash since the last report of 252 tons.
- Handled 13 recycling complaints and four trash complaints.
- Collected several compliant brush piles and T-bags.
- Used 400 tons of asphalt on 132 street repairs.
- Set out barricades and cleaned the downtown in preparation for weekend events.
- Mowed ditches and right-of-ways.
- Prepared equipment for GovDeals.
- Dura-patched 39 spots marked for repair.
- Sign shop worked on the Water Street bike lane signage and painted over 50 crosswalks and stop bars.
- Finished up our manhole reconstructions on the streets scheduled to be paved.

Electrical – Brian Ferree, Foreman

- Completed Ohio Utilities Protection Service requests as needed.
- Completed the monthly safety report for the month of September.
- Checked out and programmed the school flashers for the new school year.
- Installed three new communication boards in the traffic controller cabinets downtown.
- Upgraded and installed motor starter heaters on well 4 East.
- Relocated two traffic conduits at the corner of W. Main St. and Elm St. for the new hospital construction.
- Installed a new PED button at W. Main St. and Ridge Ave.
- Installed the Tour De Donut banners downtown.
- Installed a new signal at E. Main St. and Walnut St.
- Repaired several street lights at Duke Park.
- Repaired an electrical outlet in the Miami Shores Golf Course concession area.

Water Distribution/Sewer Maintenance - Tom Parsons, Foreman

- Marked numerous Ohio Utilities Protection Service tickets.
- Worked on numerous work orders for Billing and Collection.
- Completed non-pay shut-offs and reconnected them as they were paid.
- Investigated numerous high consumption alerts.
- Upgraded water services at residences on W. Franklin St., E. Canal St. and Oxford St.
- Repaired main breaks on Orchard Dr. and at a residence on Surrey Rd.
- Collected bacteria samples from Buffalo Pacific.
- Remediated soil at water services and catch basin repairs.
- Repaired a 12" storm line on S. Crawford St. at Ross St.

- Filled two sink holes at 210 S. Market St. with CDF (a flow able concrete).
- Jetted and televised paving list.
- Trained on a new software program.
- Vacuumed basins at the Water Treatment Plant.
- Vacuumed out the Traders lift station.

Water Treatment Plant – Jeff Monce

- Vendor completed a two day chemical cleaning of the air stripper tower media. Tests indicate cleaning will be required biennially.
- Structural engineers have recommended helical screw pier stabilization at the air stripper chemical storage pad. Work will begin within weeks.
- Painters have finished touch-up work on Train 2 clarifiers and are beginning a total recoating of the 4MG reservoir dome.
- Replacement contactors for worn EHS Booster Station motor starters have been ordered and will be installed in September.
- Vendor began replacement of 250' of lime delivery piping August 28. Work should be completed within 10 days. New lime bin level sensors will also be added.
- Maintenance staff has begun chemical cleaning and pressure washing of the filters 1-4 structural concrete. These filters have been in service since 1971.
- A successful test run of the emergency 100kW portable generator was conducted at the EHS Booster Station. A new power transfer system installed by City electricians will reduce generator set up time in the event of an outage.

Wastewater Treatment Plant – Mitch Beckner

- The concrete curb approach at the Traders lift station has been completed by the Street Department. Signage will be added stating that the pad is not available for public parking.
- The primary collector drives that were installed earlier this year have been returned for warranty work. The manufacturer had received a shipment of faulty bearings that were originally installed in the drives. By the end of this week all repairs should be completed and the new equipment should be back in operation.
- Plant employees are preparing for the major task of refitting the plant's aeration tanks. Preparation includes the preassembly of diffuser tubes and taking careful inventory of other supplies and tools needed for the job. The work will begin in late September and must be completed as quickly as possible so that the tanks can be placed back into service.

Subject: Items of Interest – Troy Industrial Building Market

As you have been hearing for some time, the focus of economic development efforts throughout Ohio has shifted from attracting new businesses to workforce development. Now, we talk about finding, attracting, and training workers to fill the many open jobs in existing and growing factories, offices, and stores. In addition, we now need to work even harder to help our existing companies find *local* space for expansion, rather than have them leave the area for larger facilities and more workers.

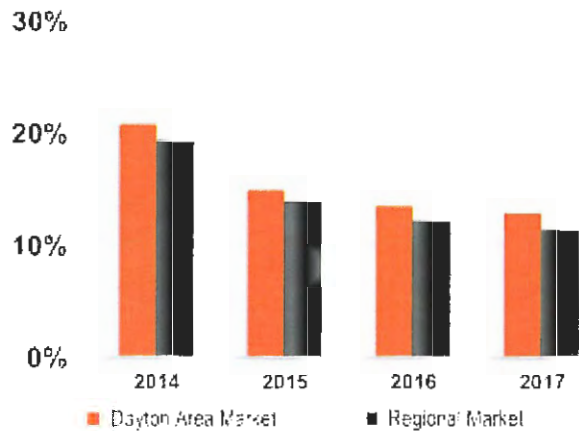
A new industrial market report from the Miller-Valentine Group highlights the regional lack of readily available industrial space for expansions. It also explains rising industrial lease rates and an emerging trend for some speculative construction, which hasn't been seen in the Dayton region for many years.

Vacancy Rate in the Dayton Industrial Market Continues to Decline

“The vacancy rate in the Dayton market continues to remain low at 11.4%. The result has been less flexibility from property owners, meaning higher lease rates and longer lease terms. Industrial users have found it increasingly difficult to find viable properties with favorable terms. Much of the remaining inventory lacks required features, is located in challenging areas or requires extensive tenant improvements.”

Dayton Regional 2017 Industrial Vacancy Rates



“As predicted in the last year’s survey, the decline in industrial vacancy has finally generated some speculative building, and multiple projects are in the planning stage. The projects include bulk warehouse buildings ranging in size from 250,000 SF to over 500,000 SF primarily in the North market near the airport where Procter & Gamble and Spectrum Brand are located. This location, with its access to I-70 and I-75, readily available land and in

some cases tax abatement, continues to draw attention from developers new to our market. We see no reason why at least one of these projects won’t get started within the next 6-12 months. Additionally, we believe owners of existing facilities will be making improvements to their inventory and buyers of older product will be providing necessary upgrades to make their facilities more appealing to users.”

SUBJECT: *Items of Interest Report*

I have attached two reports which summarize concerns that are being addressed by the Economic Development Department from August 14, 2017 to August 30, 2017.

The first report shows all permits that were issued. The permits have been separated by the wards of which they fall. There were 40 permits issued during this time period.

The second report contains the address, type of concern, and a summary of the current status of on-going violations. Both open and closed concerns are listed. These concerns are separated by the wards of which they fall. There were 66 violations addressed during this time period.

All costs associated with the removal of trash and elimination of noxious weeds will be invoiced to the property owner. Should the property owner fail to pay the invoice, the cost will be assessed to the property taxes.
